Recently Implemented Rules Bobo Kobo

During turn one, we as players passed three propositions. Proposition 301, by player and moderator Crorem, amended a mutable rule from the initial ruleset. Rule 209 describes judges and judgment. The proposed amendment altered wording of rule 209 and added clarification on how to opt into being a judge. Rather than opting out of being a judge, this amendment allows players to opt in by expressing a willingness to be judge in the actions channel. Prop 301 passed in a 12 to 1 vote.

Proposition 302, by player and moderator Alec (Poe Dameron) was a player ability proposition. Players now have the ability to submit to a judge a motion for continuance if they need/want an extension to something if they have more than 24 hours to perform an action. Prop 302 passed in a 12 to 1 vote. When asked to comment, Alec stated that "I'm always right and my proposals are great so not really surprised." and that his haters "are just fans who haven't realized it yet". Proposition 303, by player Zookfoodle, creates a gladiatorial arena. Players may choose from four unique classes to engage in battle via dice. Players have until turn 2 to choose their classes. They may do so in the game control channel via reactions. Prop 303 passed in a 10 to 1 vote. When asked to comment, Zookfoodle expressed joy that their proposal was passed.

Each unique proposal passed in a vast majority, only disputed by one player across the board.

Current Proposals Bobo Kobo

In this turn, we currently have 3 proposals ready to be voted on and 7 proposals waiting on endorsement. Proposals in the endorsement queue include two proposals to ban player Alec (Poe Dameron), one prop to make "this" a chatroom, and four proposals with depth. Player Crorem is proposing a new form of categorization called "Humors". Player Alec (Poe Dameron) is proposing to include a "Champion of the People". This proposal carries much significance for the future of Nomic 7, because it would allow for players to elect someone to the board of moderators each turn. The idea of a Champion of the people was brought into conversation in pre-Nomic 7 talks, and we are predicting a positive response to this proposal. Player Baegll is proposing a new form of currency called "Rudis". Rudis, named for the Sword of Freedom, would be acquired in player created challenges each turn. While many forms of currency have been discussed, this would be one of the first three to make its way onto the market along with "Fame" and "Points". Player Fenris is proposing "The Ascars Award", a turnly activity along with the

previously mentioned currency, "Fame".

Proposal 304, put forth by player Jahming is titled "High Score". This proposal would implement a weekly game for players to engage in. Players would compete to get the highest score on the weekly game to gain points. If a player is champion, their points gained are doubled. If passed, points would be the first form of currency implemented into the game.

Proposal 305, put forth by player Romulus, is titled "Introduction of Game Challenges". This proposal would implement player created challenges that can be completed for game advantages. This rule is significantly similar to the proposal put forth by player Baegll. This proposal is predicted to be the first with any major contention due to this point.

Proposal 306, put forth by player Fenris is titled "Fame". This proposal would implement "Fame" as a form of currency. Players would gain the ability to gain or lose fame both temporarily (through things such as being the champion) or permanently (from things such as having rules passed).
