## Opinion: Time Travel Must Be Restricted Freelance Journalist Alec

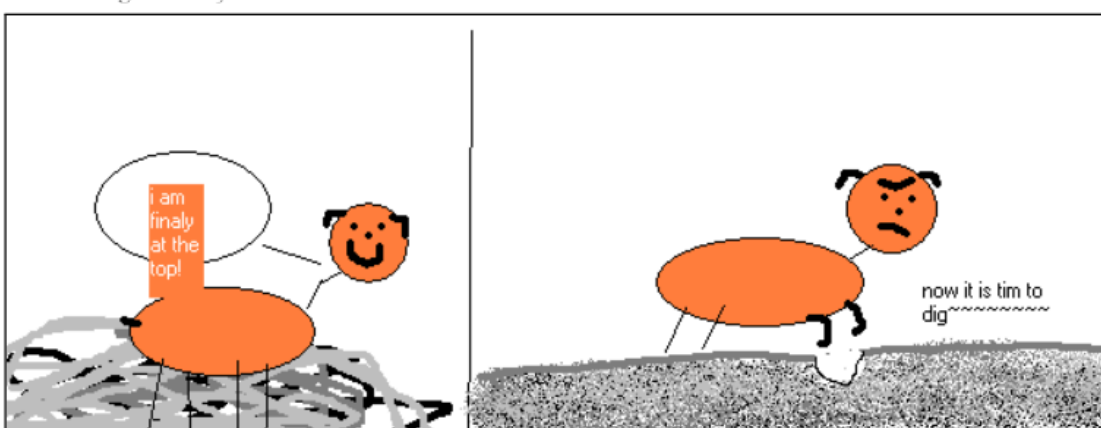
